

Welcome to St Alban's Church Maundy Thursday

This church is fitted with an induction loop system. Please switch your hearing aid to 'Two beeps' (T).

Maundy Thursday marks a new beginning, the beginning of the end. From this point on, our Christian worship is a continuum through to Easter morning.

At this service we recall our Lord washing his disciples' feet as their servant, and his sharing supper with them for the last time in his earthly life. From here he goes out into the garden of Gethsemane to his suffering and death. During this service the celebrant will wash the feet of parishioners in remembrance of our Lord's act. This will be after the sermon and those who have volunteered for this should immediately, following the sermon, come and sit on the chairs provided.

At the close of the Eucharist there will be no blessing. During the last hymn the sacrament is taken to the Altar of Repose. The altar is then stripped while the first nineteen verses of Psalm 22 are said. At this point the church lights will be extinguished and everyone is asked to remain seated in silent prayer until the lights go up again a few minutes later.

We then leave church in silence or remain for the hour's Vigil of Prayer at the altar of repose.

We now begin to recall the last events of Jesus' earthly life.

All your commands I know are true, your many gifts will make me new, Into my life your power breaks through, living Lord.

THE SERMON

THE WASHING OF FEET

The Celebrant washes the feet of members of the congregation to remind us of our Lord's action on the night of the Last Supper.

During this we sing the Taize chant...

Ubi caritas et amor, ubi caritas, Deus ibi est.

The washing of feet ends with the following prayer:

Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us that what we do for the least of our brothers and sisters we do also for you: give us the will to be the servant of others as you were the servant of all, and gave up your life and died for us, but are alive and reign, now and for ever.

Amen.

INTERCESSIONS

In the power of the Spirit let us pray to the Father through Christ, the Saviour of the world.

Father, on this, the night he was betrayed, your Son Jesus Christ washed his disciples' feet.

We commit ourselves to follow his example of love and service. Lord, hear us **and humble us.**

On this night, he prayed for his disciples to be one. We pray for the unity of your Church. Lord, hear us **and unite us.**

On this night, he prayed for those who were to believe through his disciples' message.

We pray for the mission of your Church.

Lord, hear us and renew our zeal.

On this night, he commanded his disciples to love, but suffered rejection himself.
We pray for the rejected and unloved.
Lord, hear us and fill us with your love.

On this night, he reminded his disciples that if the world hated them it hated him first. We pray for those who are persecuted for their faith. Lord, hear us **and give us your peace.**

On this night, he accepted the cup of death and looked forward to the new wine of the kingdom. We remember those who have died in the peace of Christ. Lord, hear us and welcome all your children into paradise. Amen.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Knowing that his hour had come, in his great love he gave this supper to his disciples to be a memorial of his passion, that we might proclaim his death until he comes again, and feast with him in his kingdom.

Therefore, earth unites with heaven to sing a new song of praise; we too join with angels and archangels as they proclaim your glory without end:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory.

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you.

He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; Do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Great is the mystery of faith.

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with the Blessed Virgin Mary, St Alban, and all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

TRANSFER OF THE HOLY SACRAMENT TO THE ALTAR OF REPOSE

As the sacrament is taken to the Lady Chapel, we sing:

- 1 Of the glorious Body telling, O my tongue, its mysteries sing, and the Blood, all price excelling, which the world's eternal King, in a noble womb once dwelling shed for the world's ransoming.
- 2 Given for us, for us descending, of a Virgin to proceed, man with man in converse blending, scattered he the Gospel seed, till his sojourn drew to ending, which he closed in wondrous deed.
- 3 At the last great Supper lying circled by his brethren's band, meekly with the law complying, first he finished its command then, immortal Food supplying, gave himself with his own hand.
- 4 Word made Flesh, by word he maketh very bread his Flesh to be; man in wine Christ's Blood partaketh: and if senses fail to see, faith alone the true heart waketh to behold the mystery.
- 5 Therefore we, before him bending, this great Sacrament revere; types and shadows have their ending,

for the newer rite is here; faith, our outward sense befriending, makes the inward vision clear.

6 Glory let us give, and blessing to the Father and the Son; honour, might and praise addressing, while eternal ages run; ever too his love confessing, who, from both, with both is one.

While the altar is stripped Psalm 22 is said, after which we go to the chapel of repose for the watch.

PSALM 22.1-19

- ¹ My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?
- ² O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but find no rest.
- ³ Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel.
- ⁴ In you our ancestors trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them.
- ⁵ To you they cried, and were saved; in you they trusted, and were not put to shame.
- ⁶ But I am a worm, and not human; scorned by others, and despised by the people.
- ⁷ All who see me mock at me; they make mouths at me, they shake their heads;
- 8 'Commit your cause to the Lord; let him deliver let him rescue the one in whom he delights!'

- ⁹ Yet it was you who took me from the womb; you kept me safe on my mother's breast.
- ¹⁰ On you I was cast from my birth, and since my mother bore me you have been my God.
- ¹¹ Do not be far from me, for trouble is near and there is no one to help.
- ¹² Many bulls encircle me, strong bulls of Bashan surround me;
- ¹³ they open wide their mouths at me, like a ravening and roaring lion.
- ¹⁴ I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast;
 ¹⁵ my mouth is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death.
- ¹⁶ For dogs are all around me;
 a company of evildoers encircles me.
 My hands and feet have shrivelled;
 ¹⁷ I can count all my bones.
 They stare and gloat over me;
 ¹⁸ they divide my clothes among themselves, and for my clothing they cast lots.
- ¹⁹ But you, O Lord, do not be far away! O my help, come quickly to my aid!
