THE SERMON

THE NICENE CREED *Please stand if you are able*

We believe in one God, the Father, the almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,

who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

4 With a sword-stroke, there they killed him: Felled his body to the ground, jeered and mocked the martyr's witness, laughed with cruel, spiteful sound. But, just where his blood had fallen, like the rain upon the earth, flowers sprang at once to blossom - signs of Alban's grace and worth.

5 On a hill beside a river stands the shrine of Britain's saint; honoured, loved by those who know him, freed at last from all restraint. For he stands with saints in glory, with his prayers, our feet are shod. May our courage never fail us as we journey home to God.

THE PREPARATION OF THE TABLE
